Dear Bobcat Court Applicant:

We are so pleased that you are considering applying to be a part of the Bobcat Court for Homecoming 2010.

The Bobcat Court will consist of 5 men and 5 women. Each member of the Court must be a senior and must be nominated by a registered student organization. Each registered student organization may nominate one man and one woman only.

The Bobcat Court Selection Committee will narrow the applications to a pool of finalists, and interviews will be scheduled with all the finalists. The interviews will take place during the week of October 4, 2010. Following the interviews, the Bobcat Court Selection Committee will determine the 10 students who will comprise the Bobcat Court. The Bobcat Court will be introduced at the Homecoming Kickoff on Monday, October 11, 2010 at 6:00 PM.

Throughout the week of Homecoming, the Bobcat Court members will be expected to attend various events, and the entire student body will have the opportunity to vote on who should become the 2010 Homecoming King and Queen. The King and Queen will be announced at the Yell Like Hell Pep Rally on Friday, October 15, 2010.

All Bobcat Court members will be expected to attend Homecoming events throughout the week including:

- Homecoming Kickoff, Monday, October 11
- Coffee with the Court, Tuesday, October 12
- Yell Like Yell Pep Rally, Friday, October 15
- Homecoming Parade, Saturday, October 16
- Homecoming Football Game, Saturday, October 16

An informational meeting will be held for all students interested in applying to be on the Bobcat Court. This will take place Friday, September 17, 2010 at 4:00 PM in the Amanda J. Cunningham Leadership Center.

Criteria for Bobcat Court

Character - All members of the Bobcat Court will represent Ohio University, the Ohio University Alumni Association, and the Ohio University Homecoming Steering Committee with pride and enthusiasm. The Ohio University Homecoming Steering Committee promotes students to live a healthy lifestyle. Personal integrity and character both inside and outside the classroom are important qualities that will be represented by the members of the Bobcat Court. Being a part of Ohio University, they must be committed to the highest standards of personal honesty and ethical behavior.

Citizenship - Bobcat Court members must be committed to giving back to their communities. These students are responsible for their behavior both on and off campus. These students are engaged citizens acting for the public good.

Civility – Bobcat Court members must demonstrate how they foster an atmosphere of diversity and equity within the Ohio University community. They are expected to embrace civility in communication all times.

Commitment - All members of the Bobcat Court will demonstrate commitment to their education at Ohio University by having a minimum GPA of 2.75 or higher. They will articulate how their excellence in academics is an important aspect of who they are at Ohio University.

Community – All members of the Bobcat Court will be identifiable as leaders within the Ohio University and/or Athens communities. They will represent all values of the OHIO community at all times.

Homecoming 2010 – Let the Games Begin Bobcat Court Rules and Regulations

1. All applicants for the Bobcat Court must be nominated by a registered student organization. Each organization may nominate one man and one woman only. The first man and woman submitting their applications from an organization will be accepted.
2. All members of the Bobcat Court must have senior standing. Students may be on the Bobcat Court only once during their college career, and should apply for the last Homecoming they will be on campus.
3. All Bobcat Court members will be required to attend at least one Homecoming event each day of Homecoming week. These events will be determined upon the completion of the week's itinerary. This creates a chance for candidates to receive equal exposure. The Court members will be notified of mandatory events well in advance.
4. All members of the Bobcat Court will be required to wear sashes that are provided by the Ohio University Homecoming Steering Committee throughout Homecoming week. Sashes **must not** be worn:
 - a. In the event that a candidate is speaking or presenting in any public setting other than those immediately associated with Homecoming 2010. The intent is to ensure that all candidates receive equal exposure throughout the week.
 - b. In any situation that may compromise the standards and values of Ohio University and those of the University community.
5. Bobcat Court members represent the Ohio University student body. Candidates must carry themselves professionally and act in a manner that upholds the core values of OHIO at all times.
6. All advertising related to Homecoming and the Bobcat Court will be the sole responsibility of the Ohio University Homecoming Steering Committee. No advertising may be done by individual members of the Bobcat Court or by the student organizations that nominated them.
